Organizational Philosophy

Organizational Structure

Newberry Community School is a not-for-profit corporation incorporated within the state of Florida. The organization is directed by the Governing Board who set the policies and guidelines for the organization and delegate to staff day-to-day responsibilities for operational matters. The Principal consults with staff members in order to allow for the greatest possible staff participation in the decision making of the organization. The Principal shall serve as the liaison between the Governing Board and the staff.

Non-Discrimination
